



Canes upset Georgia Tech, lose King

The Canes come off a HUGE upset win against Georgia Tech last Sunday, winning 90-82 against the Yellow Jackets. Once again, sophomore SG Jack McClinton led the team in scoring with 22 points, and senior

PG **Anthony Harris** dropped in 21 points for his best game of the season. Despite having three big men foul out and finishing the game with a 4-guard lineup, the Canes held onto the lead down the stretch with several key baskets and clutch free throw shooting.

The Canes did receive some bad news after the Georgia Tech game, however. Senior starting C **Anthony King** aggravated a wrist injury in the first half of the game and will miss the next several weeks, possibly up to a month. **King** leads the team in rebounding and blocked shots, and his absence will be a huge loss in the middle. PF **Jimmy Graham** will shift over to the center spot and PF **Ray Hicks** will take his place in the starting lineup for now.

King isn't the only injury; sophomore F **Adrian Thomas'** season is officially over as of the GT game. He suffered a sports hernia in the offseason and never was able to play fully, so he will shut it down this year and rest up, hoping to get back to full strength by next season.

Mountain Hawks fly into the Gables

The Lehigh Mountain Hawks come from Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, and are members of the Patriot League. Lehigh actually has a higher tuition than UM, charging students \$33,470 this year, with another \$8,920 tacked on for room and board. Until 1995, they were known as the Engineers, but they changed their nickname then to Mountain Hawks, after the Hawk Mountain ridge in Eastern Pennsylvania, home to thousands of eagles, hawks, and falcons. Lehigh University is coincidentally major rivals with Lafayette College, whom the Canes crushed several weeks ago in basketball. Lehigh and Lafayette share college football's most-played rivalry game, with the two teams having faced each other 142 times since 1884.



Lehigh features a team which plays well at home at Stabler Arena but tends to play poorly on the road. Lehigh lost to Princeton, 44-43, in their last game, but only lost by 6 to Notre Dame earlier in the season.

The team is led by senior G **Jose Olivero**, who averages 19 points per game. Senior F **Kyle Neptune** averages 12 points per game, to go with 5.6 boards, and senior C **Jason Mgebhoff** averages 11.6 ppg and 6.5 rebounds. **Mgebhoff** is a force down low, weighing 300 pounds, and not having **Anthony King** to guard him will hurt Miami. The Mountain Hawks lead the Patriot League in rebounding.
